Volunteers needed for Forest Schools on Friday 12 January

Year I/2N&C and Year 6 will be taking part in Forest Schools next Friday morning and afternoon respectively. Warm water proof clothes and boots will be required! As always the more adult helpers there are the better, so if you are able to volunteer your time please inform the class teacher or office staff. Many thanks.

Reminders

Children should not wear any jewellery in school, including earrings, unless permission has been requested due to particular circumstances.

PE Kits should be in school at all times and should include outdoor trainers. The children need to be able to put a dry, clean, pair of shoes on when they come back into school after outdoor PE to minimise the amount of mud in school.

Please help boost the school budget!

This term staff and governors will be working on the new school budget and as many of you will know Cambridgeshire has almost the lowest funding per child in the country. One of the ways we can increase our funding is through pupil premium. All children in Reception and KSI are entitled to free school meals but pupil premium is different and has to be applied for; it supports families on low income and can be used for example to pay for music lessons, residential and day visits, I:I tuition. If you want to find out if you are eligible you can contact the Education Welfare Benefits Team for information about the benefits which support children financially while at school on 01223 703200 or email ewb.fsm@cambridgeshire.gov.uk.

You do not need to reapply if you are already receiving pupil premium. Even if your circumstances change the funding will continue to support your children for 6 years. **Your rights**

All children who are at school under 19 at the start of the academic year (4 September 2015) and are claiming or have parents who are claiming one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit but who are not entitled to working tax credit and whose annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) does not exceed £16,190
- Guarantee element of state pension credit
- Universal Tax Credit

If you are receiving any of the eligible benefits listed above you can apply online for free school meals

If you are not sure if you are entitled to Pupil Premium just telephone 01223 703200. The only information you need is your National Insurance number, date of birth and family name.
