The End of the School Day

Reception and Key Stage I children finish school at 3.10 pm, and Key Stage 2 at 3.15 pm. All children in Reception and Key Stage I must be accompanied home by an adult. Please be aware that it is assumed that children in Years 5 and 6 are allowed to go home unaccompanied, but not Years 3 and 4 unless we have been notified by parents. Parents can collect their children from the playground, and a teacher is on duty at the gate until a bell is rung to vacate the playground, after which the gate is locked. Please leave promptly to allow staff to continue with their duties after school.
