Classroom news:

Reception

Reception have been thinking about internet safety this week. The four important rules when using the internet are: Always ask a grown-up for help if you see something strange or unusual; do not download or install anything without asking a grown up first; remember, not all games and videos are for children; don't talk to strangers online and don't tell them where you live.

Years 1 and 2

Key Stage One have had a very active final week of this half term and the sunny weather has helped. They've built on from their swimming and football skills; harvested their grown cress to make egg cress sandwiches and finally raised money by taking part in lots of fun activities arranged by the Year 6 Council House reps, as part of Newnham Croft's charity afternoon. In Maths, Year 1s have continued to apply their number bonds to 10 to add and subtract either to or from multiples of 10. They then moved on to explore adding and subtracting numbers which bridge ten using their number bonds to 10 to help them. In Year 2, the children have continued to explore using their own strategies to add two 2digit numbers together and they finished the week by working out change from a given amount. In English, all classes have written up their fact files or non-chronological reports on their chosen mini-beast. In Geography, we all looked at the features of aerial views and labelled some photographs. We finished the week by making egg cress sandwiches as part of this term's DT. The children enjoyed peeling the shells off their eggs; mixing the egg with mayonnaise; carefully adding the mixture to their buttered slice of bread; and finally sprinkling on their grown cress before eating their delicious sandwich. Well done for a fantastic half-term KS1. There will be no spellings or times tables sent out during the half term break.

Year 3

Year 3 have worked really hard over the last week. In History sessions, we looked at how the justice systems in Viking times compared and contrasted with those we find in modern times. In our Maths sessions, we started the week by identifying different types of lines and angles. Later on in the week, the children used partitioning to help multiply 1 and 2-digit numbers. In our English sessions, the children enjoyed explaining how the machines they had invented worked. In our Science session, the children used diagrams and text to describe the life cycle of a flowering plant.

Year 4

This week, in English, we have been writing biographies of other people in the class, using the notes we took last week when interviewing each other. We have been focusing on splitting the information into different paragraphs with subheadings and doing peer editing. In Maths, we have been learning and practising different methods of multiplication and division, including the grid method, the ladder method and the bus stop method (short division). In History, we wrote a diary entry from the perspective of someone aboard an invading Viking long ship, while in Science, we learned about the life cycle of a flowering plant and concluded our 5-weeklong experiment into plant growth. We also created some beautiful dragon sculptures using Modroc in Art.

Year 5

In English this week, Year 5 have been learning about persuasion. By looking at examples of flyers, magazine adverts, letters and TV advertisements, they have thought about the purpose, audience and common features. They had a go at coming up with convincing and creative ideas for alternative lessons to be taught at school and tried to expand on them to help credibility. In Maths, they have been looking at scaling with fractions, squared and cubed numbers and various methods for multiplication. Their progression of skills in techniques needed to play rounders in PE has been impressive. They've mastered batting, bowling and fielding skills which we'll be putting into action when we play games after half term.

Year 6

On Monday, Year 6 worked on informal informational texts about British monarchs. On Tuesday, the class took a trip to Grantchester Meadows to look at water for an Art project. On Wednesday, we did magic squares (Sudoku) and in English practised our inference skills looking at a picture book called Flotsam. On Thursday, the class wrote about the setting for the Flotsam book and in Music made a video using Garage Band. Finally, on Friday we ran a charity afternoon, raising money for Cancer Research. *By Diogo and Nico*
