### Dear Parents, Carers and Children

We are well and truly into the new term now, and all the classes are well into their new topics. Incorporated into these topics are a few trips that you will be hearing about soon, which will help these topics come alive.

We also have a KS2 visit to see Michael Rosen at the Guildhall in Cambridge next Tuesday morning to look forward to. This should really inspire some of our promising writers and poets into enjoying the process of writing even more.

Attached to this newsletter you will find some materials and advice on how to create a maths-rich household for your children. This is a follow up to the year group expectation leaflets sent to you before Christmas and should be read alongside those documents. Shortly we will also be sending out our new Calculation Policy, which should further help you in carrying out effective home learning in maths which is in line with the school's teaching. The Calculation Policy is designed as a vehicle for explaining how the written processes for calculations are taught in the school. It demonstrates how resources are used in school, how they develop into pictorial methods and how this subsequently leads for formal abstract processes. It should be considered an addition to the Maths Policy as it does not refer to mental methods and the use of investigations etc.
