

Italian Day

On Monday 20th October please come to school wearing something green, white and red. We will celebrate the week dedicated to the Italian language promoted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs all over the world, visit the website: www.esteri.it and click on Settimana della Lingua Italiana nel mondo 20/25 Ottobre 2014. Maria Carmen Triola (Marica) our Italian teacher will prepare, with the help of some students in year 6 and the great expertise of Michelle and her staff, the Italian school dinner for the day. Assembly will be ruled by the students in KS1 accompanied by the music teacher Katerina Onatskaia



and Mrs Triola. Year 1/2N students will perform the welcome song *Buongiorno* in four/five different versions: regular, quiet, fast, slow and in English. Then the Chick song *La settimana del pulcino* song about the days of the week in Italian and in English. Year 1/2C students will introduce the Italian flag with its colours, the vowels in Italian, the correct pronunciation of the vowels in Italian and examples of cognates words in Italian and English and they will sing the colour song created by them according to their clothes red, orange, green, blue, yellow, purple, black, brown and white. Year R/1 students will show how to easily learn numbers in Italian from number one to number five in different ways. Thank you for your support and participation.
