## Classroom news

### Reception

As we say goodbye to the first half of the summer term, Reception has wowed us by writing short stories based on the book *Aaaagh Spider!* by Lydia Monks. All the children used their knowledge of phonics and tricky words to support their writing. In Phonics, we explored longer words ending in **-ing**, such as *swimming*, and words ending in **-ed**, such as *melted* and *shifted*. We recapped the tricky words *out* and *today*. Reception also had their phonics assessments this week. In maths, we have been learning to count in tens from 0 to 100. In science, the children explored different habitats and matched animals to their correct habitats. On Thursday, as part of International Afternoon, all the children sang a song related to India in front of parents and the rest of the school. They thoroughly enjoyed singing and dancing and performed beautifully. Well done, Reception, for a brilliant half term!

### Year 1

In English, Year 1 has been finding out about the use of letter writing. We have watched films about how post is processed, have read postcards and letters from fictional characters and written thankyou postcards to actual people we know. A couple of weeks ago the children in Year 1 wrote individual letters to the children in Year 2, describing what they enjoyed doing in Year 1. This week, the Year 2 children responded, which was very exciting. The class were able to find out about what it is like to be in Year 2 and are very much looking forward to this in September.

### Year 2

We've had a very busy and exciting final week in Year 2! The children carefully created their minibeast clay tiles based on their own designs and tackled some challenging addition and subtraction problems in maths, using running totals and reasoning skills. In English, they finished their thoughtful responses to Year 1's fantastic letters and impressed us with their Big Write, using similes and showcasing all they've learnt so far. In geography, they turned their findings into bar charts and confidently asked and answered questions about the data. In RE, we explored different objects used during prayer. Well done to all the children for their hard work – have a restful and enjoyable half-term!

### Year 3

Year 3 has worked really hard throughout the week. In maths sessions, the children have identified the number and

shapes of faces of various 3D shapes. In our English sessions the children have really enjoyed writing explanation texts on how to play Kabaddi. In geography, we looked at the different uses rivers are put to. In computing, the children learnt to edit and change features on a word document. In PE children have been continuing to learn how to hold a tennis racket correctly and to aim the ball in different areas of the court.

### Year 4

This week, Year 4 have finished their play scripts of their innovated story of *The Princess and the Pea*. They are absolutely amazing, Year 4 has done a wonderful job with a style of writing that some may not feel as confident in. In maths, we have started looking at converting cm into m. Year 4 measured classroom objects, recorded the measurement, and then converted it into another unit. In geography, Year 4 worked really hard on their projects for international afternoon, they looked fabulous. They made a range of models, posters and drawings, exploring the River Ganges. A reminder that the week after half term is the MTC. Times table practice over half term is strongly encouraged

### Year 5

We had a great week with our dress rehearsal and final performance of the play we have been working hard on for the last few weeks. In maths, we revised short multiplication and then moved onto using long multiplication to multiply pairs of 2-digit numbers. In science, we learned about the different things we are able to do at different ages and discussed the milestones we have already reached.

### Year 6

This week we did a number of things including International Afternoon, making our yearbook pages and our Indian projects. During International Afternoon, we sang songs, cooked food and dressed up in clothes representing our country. We also made Indian projects such as artwork, posters and many other things. In maths, we have been looking at pentominoes and grids. Haru was the first to complete the 10 x 6 grid, the hardest one of all of them.
