On Monday 6th October at 11 am we will celebrate harvest with a special assembly about farming in the Fens presented by a teacher from the Farmland Museum. We welcome donations of food on the day which will be given to Jimmy's Night Shelter. Parents are welcome to join us for the assembly.

On Monday 20th October 10.15 am we will be celebrating the international Italian language week.. The assembly will be led by our KSI Italian teacher since 2012, Maria Carmen Triola and our music teacher Mrs Onatskaia. KSI students will sing and introduce in English and in Italian the three most popular Italian songs: Fratelli d'Italia the Italian Anthem (God save the Queen), Fra Martino Campanaro (Are you Sleeping Brother John) and Il ballo del qua qua (Chicken dance). Parents are welcome to join us for the assembly. Free School Meal and Pupil Premium

The County Council asks all families (R, KSI and 2) who are eligible (see details on the attached form) for Free School Meals (FSM) to put in an application because even if you do not want the free meal our school will get valuable additional funding, called the Pupil Premium. We are sending this letter to all parents for two reasons. Firstly, from September, all Reception/KSI children are entitled to a free meal as part of the Government's Universal Infants FSM Programme, but unless eligible families apply the school will not get the Pupil Premium funding. Secondly, we are not told who is eligible do know 20% apply but we that children in Cambridgeshire are currently missing out.
